Good morning, everyone. Today you're going to write a story about being sick and what happens when you are sick. Talk with your partners about what happens when or if you get sick, things like medicine, visits to the hospital, staying in the hospital and what makes you feel better. Then you can listen to the poem I found.

Mrs. Wong, can we write about simple things like getting a cold or does it have to be something like breaking an arm or something much more serious?

Mrs. Wong -**English Teacher** It's up to you, Tommy.

Thanks, Mrs. Wong. OK, Sandra, I'll start. I broke my arm last year playing basketball. I had to go to hospital in the ambulance.

Sandra -Student

I remember that, Tommy. Your arm was in plaster for a long time. Everyone wrote or drew pictures on your arm. The plaster cast was really colourful.

Tommy -Student Sandra –

It was colourful but when it got cut off, it smelled horrible!

Ooh, they had to cut it off! Wasn't that scary?

Student Tommy -Student

Yes, it was but the doctors made me feel comfortable and told me what they were going to do and why. Also, my mum was with me, so I felt okay.

Sandra -Student

What was the trip in the ambulance like, Tommy?
